Age Group 5 - 11

Tales from the Riverbank - 1 x 15 minute programme

This programme follows a group of students on a hands-on geography field trip to study the stream that flows through their village.

Weather Around the World - 1 x 15 minute programme

A series of five short videos filmed in five different climatic regions. Each clip contains details of the local climate and its significance in Canada, The Alps, Australia, Uganda and Egypt.

Age Group 11 - 16

Secondary Geography - 3 x 15 minute programmes

- **The A-Z of Global Warming** - A programme examining the vast and complex topic of climate change taking us through an A-Z of the main issues.
- **Migrant Stories** - This programme shows moving stories about refugees, asylum seekers and economic migrants.
- **Iceland - The Sights** - A programme following a student fieldtrip to Iceland to get a close-up view of geological features such as geysers, waterfalls, volcanoes and glaciers.

New Arts Programming

Age Group 4 - 11

Primary Drama and Music - 2 x 15 minute programmes

- **The Garage** - This programme has been made for early years practitioners to show pupils in class to promote and inspire creative role play. Taking a close up look at what happens in a busy petrol station it has no narration leaving room for the practitioner to make commentary.
- **Three Songs** - This programme introduces simple vocal warm-up and teaches three easy to learn classroom songs.

New Business Programming

Age Group 14 - 16

On The Street Where We Work - 1 x 15 minute programme

Split into separate sections, this programme features three types and sizes of business. All working on the same street. Each business describe it's aims and objectives, it's business plan, it's marketing and plans for the future.

Reading and Writing - 3 x 15 minute programmes

- **Whiteboard Literacy: Story Starts** - This programme focuses on video clips designed for teachers to use on their interactive whiteboard when teaching.
- **Three Kinds of Writing** - Three forms of writing are visually illustrated in this programme.

Two Travel Texts - The Guide Book and the Travelogue - 1 x 15 minute programme

In this programme, two different travel writers explain the processes involved in researching and writing for different purposes and audiences.

New Maths Programming

Age Group 7 - 11

Maths for 7 - 11 Year Olds - 2 x 15 minute programmes

- **The Shape Show** - A parade of shapes introduces the properties of 2-D four-sided and three-sided shapes. Children are encouraged to identify these in the environment around them.
- **Maths Stories** - This programme contains seven clips for whole-class use, preferably on an interactive whiteboard that will support several lessons.

Age Group 11 - 16

Starters - 3 x 15 minute programmes

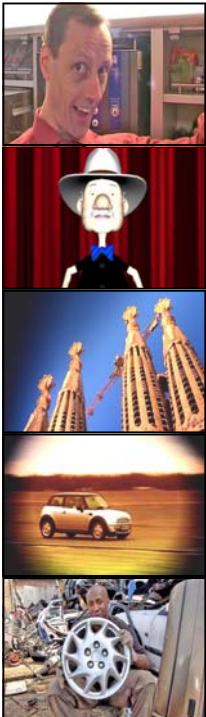
Presented by maths expert and performer Isaac Anoon in real-life urban settings, these programmes are designed to be shown in sections, with useful pause points for discussion, clues and sometimes even answers.

- **Scrapyard Starters** - Covers topics; probability, ratio and proportion, rotational symmetry, square numbers and circles.
- **Building Yard Starters** - Covers topics; how to estimate lengths, using nets to work out the shortest routes, making sense of ratios, area and perimeter, working out volume, exploring number sequences.
- **Shopping Mall Starters** - Covers topics; working out the area of an octagon, calculating the percentages and VAT, working out the best value for money, practical probability, organising fractions with a card trick, various ways of cutting a cake.

A World of Maths - 6 x 15 minute programmes

Each programme is set at a different location and each contains a number of short sequences designed to pose a question intended to stimulate mathematical discussion.

- **Episodes: A Night Train, An Ice Rink, The Mini, The Cricket Match, Barcelona's Big Church, A Hotel.**

- **The Jazz Age** - Ben Walsh presents this archive film-based programme documenting America from the Treaty of Versailles to the Wall Street Crash.
- **Cuban Missile Crisis** - This programme features 11 extracts from various film sources on the Cuban Missile crisis.

This programme features three ceremonies from three different religions to illustrate the cycle of life. The programme depicts the real ceremonies and features interviews with the participants who share their understanding of what their religion means to them.

Age Group 5 - 11

PHSE for 5 - 11 Year Olds - 3 x 15 minute programmes

- **Personal Stories** - Personal and health issues are highlighted through 3 independent stories.
- **Beat Bullying** - This programme aims to help tackle bullying by exploring the feelings of all those involved.
- **Emotions in Motion** - In this programme, pupils aged 7 – 11 present their own show where feelings are the topic of the day.

Schools Council - 2 x 15 minute programmes

- **Speak Out** - In this programme pupils at West Bridgeford Primary School explain how their school council operates and advise pupil viewers on how to set up their own school council.
- **Say Your Piece** - In this programme students at Lymm High School offer advice and insight for other students on how their school council operates

Age Group 7 - 16

Personal Finance Education - 2 x 15 minute programmes

- **Catriona's Big Day Out** - This programme, which is intended for pupils aged 7-11, follows ten-year-old Catriona on her financial journey as she saves up and budgets for a day out for her parents and best friend.
- **Paying your Own Way** - This programme follows 18-year-old Jo and his 16-year-old brother Tom as they set up home on their own for the first time.

Age Group 11 - 16

PHSE for 11-16 Year Olds - 4 x 15 minute programmes

- **In and Out of Trouble** - This programme features three teenagers talking frankly about the problems they have had with crime, drugs and truancy.
- **Alcohol Stories** - This programme focuses on four young people, each with a story to tell about their personal experience of alcohol and how it can change a persons life.
- **Resolving Conflict** - This programme explores the strategies that young people can use to resolve conflict.
- **Teenage Pregnancy** - Two 16-year-old mums tell us about the day that changed their lives forever.

Citizenship for 11-16 Year Olds - 4 x 15 minute programmes

- **My World, My Democracy** - This programme explores what citizenship and democracy means to different people depending on their circumstances.
- **Letters to Death Row** - A look at the letter writing campaigns that have saved three individuals who had been placed on death row.
- **Dan's ASBO** - This programme helps students to learn more about ASBOs and the criminal justice process.
- **The Human Rights Experience** - A look at how human rights issues can be taught in the classroom.

Skills for Life in Context: Social Care and Health & Beauty - 4 x 15 minute programmes

- **Social Care 1 - A day in the Home** - This programme provides an insight into the way a young key worker uses literacy, numeracy and ICT in her job at a residential care home.
- **Social Care 2 - A Day Out** - This programme looks at the literacy, numeracy and ICT skills used by social workers as they look after a group of elderly care home residents.
- **Health and Beauty 1 - Inside the Salon** - This programme provides an insight into the various skills used by a young hairdresser working in a prestigious hair salon.
- **Health and Beauty 2 - Inside the Gym** - In this programme, a gym fitness instructor demonstrates how ICT, numeracy and literacy skills are vital to his job.

Skills for Life in Context: Construction and Engineering - 4 x 15 minute programmes

- **Construction 1 - The Gas Fitter** - What have literacy, numeracy and ICT skills got to do with fitting central heating systems? Gas fitter Philip Parker shows just how important they are.
- **Construction 2 - Safety on Site** - In this programme, the section manager of a large construction company demonstrates the skills needed to ensure a project is completed safely, on time, and on budget.
- **Engineering 1 - Lifeboats** - In this programme, marine engineer Spencer Johns takes us on a tour of the Royal National Lifeboat Institution's headquarters in Poole. As a part of a team of engineers he is responsible for keeping their fleet of boats up and running.
- **Engineering 2 - MOT and Service** - In this programme, trainee mechanic Louise Upton takes a car through its MOT and service, demonstrating the skills that are vital to her hands-on role.

Science Stories - 1 x 15 minute programme

This programme takes a look at the following topics in a farmyard setting: living things, growing and changing, and growing plants.

Science Tube - 6 x 15 minute programmes

- **Light Show** - This programme takes an in-depth look at the properties of light.
- **Action!** - This programme is looking at what forces are, what they do and how they can be measured.
- **Bugs** - This episode delves into the world of micro-organisms.
- **How Stuff Changes** - This programme explores the non-reversible changes that result in the formation of new materials.
- **What Stuff Does** - This fascinating programme explores the properties and uses of the diverse materials that surround us.
- **Green World** - This programme shows how plants adapt to their environment and how they are essential to our lives.

Age Group 11 - 16

How Science Works - 2 x 15 minute programmes

- **Chasing the Wind** - This programme examines the changing climate and what can be done about it.
- **Bad Vibes** - This programme follows acoustic engineer Trevor Cox's quest to discover the worst sound in the world.

The Issue - 3 x 15 minute programmes

- **Fighting HIV** - This programme follows HIV positive Clint Walkers' personal journey through therapy and treatment.
- **Cancer and the Genome** - This programme follows Sarah Walsh, a young woman living with melanoma. It examines what is cancer and why it happens.
- **Stem Cell Research** - This programme follows Stephen Cuff, a sufferer of Parkinsons Disease. It examines the use of stem cell therapy for its treatment and the ethical debate surrounding it.

Periodic Table: Ferocious Elements - 1 x 15 minute programme

There are more than 100 elements in our universe, 81 of which are metals. This programme uses the periodic table to explore some of these elements and discover why some are more reactive than others.

Big Screen Science - 3 x 15 minute programmes

- **Stem Cell Controversy** - Craig McMillan, a wheelchair user, investigates the moral and ethical dilemmas of stem cell therapy and questions whether it will ultimately affect his own disability.
- **The Perry Pigger Show** - This animated film tackles the complex subject of xenotransplantation using the format of a popular chat show hosted by a cartoon character named Perry Pigger. Using a cartoon character and a familiar TV format helps make a difficult topic fun and accessible.
- **Law of Averages** - This programme explores the issue of kidney transplantation in a short drama made and acted by a group of students from Barrhead School near Glasgow.
